Sleuths of the Silver Screen (Session 1B)

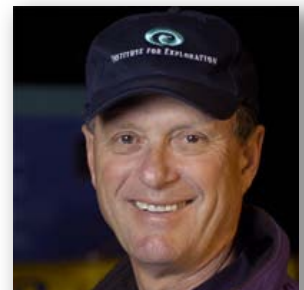

China's First Emperor and the Terra Cotta Warriors (Session 3A)

It was early spring of 1974 and a number of workmen from Xiyang village in China were digging a well. In the process, they came upon the figure of a soldier constructed of Terra Cotta. The figure was over 6 feet tall and had been painted in bright colors. This figure alone would have been a notable discovery, however as they continued digging, other figures were found nearby. Today the number of warriors total near eight thousand (8,000). Come for a fascinating account of the life of the first Emperor of China, Qin Shi Huang and the creation of this incredibly constructed army. *Instructor: Dr. Donald Koones*

U.S. Ships: The Frigates *Constellation* and *Chesapeake* and the Privateer *Chasseur* (Section 3C)

We will first learn about the characteristics and uses of frigates and privateers during the War of 1812 and their differences. We will also discuss the service of two U.S. naval frigates, the *Constellation*, built in Baltimore, and the *Chesapeake*, built in current Newport News; and the service of the privateer, *Chasseur*. It was the *Chesapeake's* captain, James Lawrence, who gave us the phrase, "Don't give up the ship." The *Chasseur* was a "Baltimore clipper," whose captain issued a blockade of the British Isles. *Instructor: Roger Swartz*
