

## **GARDEN SPOT VILLAGE ANNOUNCES AFTERNOON PRESENTATION BY DR. LEONARD SWEET**

*Program for residents and public follows morning presentation for pastors and church leaders*

**NEW HOLLAND, Pa. — Apr. 29, 2011** — Garden Spot Village has added a second presentation by Dr. Leonard Sweet on Tues., May 10. In addition to a breakfast program on evangelism for pastors and other church leaders, Sweet will present a free program residents and the public from 1:30 p.m. until 3 p.m. in the Garden Towers meeting room, on the campus of the community at 433 S. Kinzer Ave. in New Holland.

The afternoon program will focus on the three “ages” of life, a revolutionary concept based on new insights into life expectancy in the ancient world.

Founder and president of SpiritVenture Ministries, Sweet has authored dozens of books, including *The Gospel According to Starbucks*, *A Cup of Coffee at the Soul Café*, *New Life in the Spirit* and *FaithQuakes*. Sweet has served as the E. Stanley Jones Professor of Evangelism at Drew University and president and professor of church history at United Theological Seminary. Today, bridging the worlds of academia and popular culture, he communicates the gospel powerfully, sharing his insights into Scripture and its relationship to current events and life in an increasingly digital world.
